

Korean War Clearly Verified That U.S. Imperialism Is the Chieftain of Aggression

On June, 25, 1950, the U.S. imperialists, hell-bent on their ambition for world domination, finally inflicted a disastrous war on our people. Our young Republic with a history of just two years since its founding had to wage a serious confrontation with the imperialist allied forces for three years.

The war brought to our people untold miseries and pains and tremendous loss of manpower and materials, and left never-healing wounds.

For this war, the U.S. imperialists mobilized a huge military force consisting of a third of their army, a fifth of their air force, most of the U.S. Pacific Fleet, armed forces of its vassal states and others which altogether amounted to over two million individuals.

It also lavished a military expenditure of more than twenty billion US dollars and squandered over seventy-three million tons of war supplies which was eleven times as much as the materials they spent during the Pacific War.

The war between our country and the U.S. was literally beyond imagination, with an enormous gap between the two belligerents in numerical and technological terms.

In such a challenging war unprecedented in the world's war history, our army and people defeated the U.S. imperialists boasting of being the "strongest" in the world, and thus safeguarded the dignity and sovereignty of the motherland and protected the world's peace and security and the future of mankind at the cost of their blood.

The Korean War most clearly showed who is the champion of peace and who is the peacebreaker. It verified before the world that the U.S. imperialism is the chieftain of aggression.

The U.S. imperialists had posed as "liberators" and "guardians of peace" during the days of the Second World War and thenceforth.

They had built up public opinion as if all the credit for defeating German fascists and Japanese militarists and saving global peace and human civilization went to themselves.

Nevertheless, the Korean War exposed to the whole world that the U.S. imperialists are the most vicious aggressors, enemies of peace and beasts in human form, not apostles of peace.

The U.S. imperialists, who were bragging about the clean record of victory in aggression wars, provoked the war, vaunting to conquer our country within a short period.

This was the first step of their moves to realize their ambition for dominating the world by expanding the sphere of domination throughout the Korean Peninsula and, moreover, by igniting the Third World War.

The U.S. imperialists, murderers and wreckers, totally gave themselves away in the Korean War.

They shot, beat, and burnt innocent people to death everywhere they went and, worse still, slaughtered our people in the indescribably barbarous and medieval methods.

They rained germ bombs and toxic shells, whose usage was strictly forbidden, on the kind-hearted people.

The U.S. imperialists devastated our country by means of indiscriminate bombing.

In Pyongyang City alone, they dropped more than 428 000 bombs, the number of which is bigger than that of the population, and thus turned the city into ruins with not a single undamaged building.

Throughout the war, they dropped eighteen bombs per one square kilometer of the territory of the Republic on an average, thereby reducing all the dwelling houses, cultural and public health facilities and factories to ashes.

Far over one million innocent and peaceful residents lost their lives in our Republic owing to the atrocious crimes of the U.S. imperialists.

The Korean War became a death-defying battle of the righteous guardians of peace versus the vicious aggressors, murderers and wreckers.

Our army and people brought the aggressors to their knees, cleared away the hourly-approaching crisis of nuclear war and safeguarded the peaceful environment of development of the world by fighting at the cost of their lives while displaying ennobling patriotism, mass heroism and matchless bravery.

We made the U.S. imperialists taste the bitterness of downfall by winning great victory and drove the war maniacs to despair.

The U.S. suffered a military loss which was nearly 2.3 times their loss in the Pacific War.

Without the war victory of Korea, a nuclear holocaust would have swept the world and mankind would have been exposed to another volley of gunfire even before the aftermath of the Second World War faded away.
